21	Introductory Statement 1. IOC brings this lawsuit under the California Public Records Act ("CPRA"), as well as					
22	the California Constitution, the common law, and other applicable legal authorities. IOC made lawful					
23	CPRA requests to Defendants/Respondents, but they have illegally failed to respond to the requests and					
24	produce responsive public records.					
25	Parties					
26	2. IOC is a non-profit organization formed and operating under the laws of the State of					
27	California. One of its primary roles as a government "watchdog" is ensuring that public agencies					
28	comply with all applicable laws aimed at promoting transparency and accountability in government.					
	comply whit an application laws annot at promoting transparency and accountability in government.					

3. Defendant and Respondent WESTMINSTER SCHOOL DISTRICT ("WSD") is a "local agency" within the meaning of Government Code Section 6252.

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4. The true names and capacities of the Defendants/Respondents identified as DOES 1 through 100 are unknown to IOC, who will seek the Court's permission to amend this pleading in order 4 5 to allege the true names and capacities as soon as they are ascertained. IOC is informed and believes 6 and on that basis alleges that each of the fictitiously named Defendants/Respondents 1 through 100 has 7 jurisdiction by law over one or more aspects of the public records that are the subject of this lawsuit or 8 has some other cognizable interest in the public records.

9 5. IOC is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that, at all times stated in this pleading, each Defendant/Respondent was the agent, servant, or employee of every other 10 11 Defendant/Respondent and was, in doing the things alleged in this pleading, acting within the scope of 12 said agency, servitude, or employment and with the full knowledge or subsequent ratification of his 13 principals, masters, and employers. Alternatively, in doing the things alleged in this pleading, cach 14 Defendant/Respondent was acting alone and solely to further his own interests.

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Jurisdiction and Venue

16 6. The Court has jurisdiction over this lawsuit pursuant to Government Code Sections 6258 17 and 6259; Code of Civil Procedure Sections 526a, 1060 et seq., and 1084 et seq.; the California Constitution, and the common law, among other provisions of law. 18

19 7. Venue in this Court is proper because the obligations, liabilities, and violations of law 20 alleged in this pleading occurred in the County of Orange in the State of California.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION: Violation of Open-Government Laws (Against All Defendants/Respondents)

8. The preceding allegations in this pleading are fully incorporated into this paragraph. 23 24 9. On or about June 28, 2017, IOC caused to be submitted to WSD a request for certain

public records pertaining to one of WSD's former employees ("IOC Request"). A true and correct copy 25 of the IOC Request is attached to this pleading as Exhibit "A." 26

27 The IOC Request was delivered to WSD via a successful fax transmission to 714-899-10. 2781. 28

COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF ETC.

1 11. WSD's Internet home page website states that the number for fax transmissions to WSD
 2 is 714-899-2781. A true and correct copy of the bottom portion of WSD's home page is attached to this
 3 pleading as Exhibit "B."

12. WSD has not responded to the IOC Request.

5 13. WSD has violated the controlling legal authorities in at least two ways. By way of
6 example and not limitation (including alternative theories of liability):

A. IOC is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that at least one public
record responsive to the IOC Request exists and was not turned over by WSD.

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B. WSD has not responded to the IOC Request despite the passage of more than 10 days and all other extension periods to which WSD would have been entitled by law.

11 14. IOC and other members of the public have been harmed as a result of
12 Defendants'/Respondents' failure to produce the public records responsive to the IOC Response. By
13 way of example and not limitation, the legal rights of IOC and its members to access information
14 concerning the conduct of the people's business is being violated and continues to be violated.

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SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION: Declaratory Relief under Code of Civil Procedure Section 1060 et seq.

(Against All Defendants/Respondents)

17 17. The preceding allegations in this pleading are fully incorporated into this paragraph. 18. IOC is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that an actual controversy exists 18 19 between IOC, on the one hand, and Defendants/Respondents, on the other hand, concerning their respective rights and duties under the CPRA, the California Constitution, the common law, and other 20 21 applicable legal authorities. As alleged in this pleading, IOC contends that records responsive to the IOC Request exist and that Defendants/Respondents are required by law to produce them and to respond 22 to the IOC Request; whereas Defendants/Respondents dispute IOC's contention. 23

IOC desires a judicial determination and declaration as to whether
Defendants/Respondents properly responded to the IOC Request, whether disclosable public records
were unlawfully withheld by Defendants/Respondents, and whether they were required by law to
produce such records in a timely manner.

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Prayer

FOR ALL THESE REASONS, IOC respectfully prays for the following relief against all Defendants/Respondents (and any and all other parties who may oppose IOC in this lawsuit) jointly and severally:

This punishment applies even when the officer maintains custody of such records outside your agency's office or on the officer's private property.

Because the law requires you to assist members of the public in making a focused and effective request that reasonably describes identifiable records, I will assume that you fully understand what public records are being sought unless I receive written correspondence from you to the contrary.
