At 8:30 a.m. on January 29, 2015, in Department S37 of the San Bernardino County Superior Court, before the Honorable David S. Cohn, this matter came on for a hearing on the motion for summary judgment by Plaintiff and Petitioner ("Plaintiff") Gabriel Hernandez against Defendant and Respondent ("Defendant") Town of Apple Valley and Defendant and Real Party in Interest ("Real Party in Interest") Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. Plaintiff appeared by and through attorney Cory J. Briggs, Defendant appeared by and through attorney Danielle G. Sakai, and Real Party in Interest appeared by and through attorneys Jack S.
